GETTING A STUDENT VISA

GET YOUR F-1 VISA

You must have a valid passport in order to obtain a US visa. Your passport must be valid for at least six months at all times while you are living in the US.

Before visiting the US Consulate for your visa, please carefully read the instructions on the I-20 Certificate of Eligibility issued to you for your studies at OSU. Students with an I-20 will apply for an F-1 student visa.

THE SEVIS I-901 FEE

The US Government requires that international students pay a SEVIS I-901 fee based on the SEVIS ID number on your I-20 when applying for an F-1 visa. The fee must be paid prior to the visa interview at the US Consulate. This fee is in addition to the visa application fee.

At the time of your visa interview, you will need to provide documents certifying the amounts and sources of financial support for your studies. In addition, you will need to present your I-20, SEVIS fee payment receipt, and proof of financial support to a US immigration official at the Port of Entry.

HOW TO PAY THE SEVIS I-901 FEE

Continuing students transferring from another US institution and dependents applying for an F-2 visa do not usually need to pay the SEVIS I-901 fee.



Your SEVIS ID number can be found above the bar code on the top right-hand side of your I-20 form. Use OSU School Code: P00214F00002000. You will need to be connected to a printer in order to print your fee payment receipt.

- 1. Go to the SEVIS I-901 fee website, www.fmjfee.com/i901fee/, and complete the SEVIS Form I-901.
- 2. Pay the fee at least three business days before applying for your visa interview. You will need to pay with a credit/debit card.
- 3. Print your payment receipt. Your SEVIS I-901 fee receipt is required for your visa interview.
- 4. Bring your SEVIS I-901 fee receipt with you to the embassy or consulate and when you enter the US.

SEVIS FEE FOR TRANSFER STUDENTS

F-1 visa holders coming to OSU from another US school must complete an F-1 Transfer In Form within the first two weeks of class.

Failure to complete this process may result in a violation of your visa status. If you plan to travel outside the US before beginning your first term at OSU, please indicate that you will need the OSU I-20 for re-entry purposes. Do not use your previous school's I-20 for re-entry into the US.

BRINGING DEPENDENTS

Your spouse or child(ren) may be able to accompany you on an F-2 dependent visa. F-2 visa holders are not allowed to work, or pursue a degree program, Academic English or any other full-time language training program.

MEDICAL

IMMUNIZATIONS

The State of Oregon requires international students to provide proof of two (2) doses of measles, mumps, and rubella vaccine (MMR) (either combined in the MMR vaccine or given as individual doses) before you can register for classes. Students will attend a Student Health Check-in during Orientation. At that time, they can submit medical records, and/or receive an MMR shot if necessary, in order to be able to register on time.

We recommend students complete and submit the Immunization Documentation Form two weeks before their program start date in order to avoid possible delay in class registration and Late Fees. This form can be found on page 8-9.

You and your doctor will need to complete the Immunization Documentation Form. It must be signed by your doctor and show:

Two doses of MMR given on or after your first birthday, and 28 days apart

-OR-

One dose of MMR given within 30 days prior to your course start date (you can receive the second dose after you have arrived).

Students must also complete the International Student Health Information Form, available on the Patient Portal of the OSU Student Health Services (SHS) website.

TUBERCULOSIS SCREENING

Students from countries identified as high risk for tuberculosis (TB) are required to complete a tuberculosis screening after arrival in the US. You will get more information about this process during Orientation. You do not need to submit any records in advance. If you are transferring from a US institution and have already completed a TB screening, you can have your records transferred to OSU.

Bring a copy of ALL prescriptions for medicines, eyeglasses, and contact lenses with you to the US. The prescriptions should be written in English.

IMMUNIZATION FORM

All international students are required to show proof of immunization against measles, mumps, and rubella (MMR). Students cannot register for classes until this requirement has been completed. You must attach photocopies of your immunization records, or have your doctor/clinic sign/stamp this form.

HEALTH INSURANCE

HEALTH INSURANCE

Oregon State University requires international students be covered by health insurance which meets the US Government visa requirements, State of Oregon requirements and Oregon State University requirements. For this reason, the OSU International Student Health Plan is automatically added to the invoice of all INTO OSII students

The OSU health plan covers INTO OSU students beginning five days before the program start date, and extends five days past the program end date to cover travel periods.


In rare instances, if a student can show proof of equivalent or greater health insurance coverage from a private insurer, students can be waived of the OSU insurance requirement. This may include a sponsor's insurance plan. Travel insurance policies are not accepted for waiver. To apply for the waiver, you must provide a complete copy of your health insurance plan, in English with coverage amounts in US Dollars.

DEPENDENT COVERAGE

Health insurance coverage for dependent spouses and family members traveling with an international OSU student is available at an additional cost. If you would like to enroll your family members for dependent coverage, visit the Student Health Center after you arrive to complete and submit enrollment forms by the end of the third Friday of the term.

PAYING FOR YOUR INSURANCE

The cost of the OSU International Student Health Plan will be charged to your OSU student account each term upon registration. Students may pay online, through the OSU Student Health Services Office or through the OSU Cashier's Office. Payment is due by the third Friday of the term; otherwise students may be prevented from registering for classes for the following term.

Please note that INTO OSU does not accept payments for student health insurance.

SAFETY

CORVALLIS SAFETY INFORMATION

Corvallis and Oregon State University are very safe and welcoming places. However, it is important to be aware of possible threats and take steps to help ensure the safety of your property and yourself. The most common crime in Corvallis is theft. Follow these steps to prevent thieves from taking advantage of your unprotected property:

- Lock up your bicycle whenever you leave it unattended. Securely lock your bike through the frame and both wheels. Don't buy an expensive bike, as it will be more attractive to thieves.
- Do not leave items unattended in the library. Even textbooks may be stolen, as thieves hope to sell the books for cash.
- Always keep your OSU ID card on you and safe, as a thief could use the money attached to the card to make purchases on campus.
- Always lock the door to your house, apartment or dorm room when you leave. It is also a good idea to lock your windows.
- Always lock your car when you are not using it. Do not leave valuable items in your car.
- Do not keep a lot of cash with you or in your apartment or dorm room. Keep it in the bank until you need it.

CAMPUS SAFETY TIPS

- At night, use well-lit and well-traveled routes. Avoid dark, vacant areas.
- Travel with a friend or in a group.
- Saferide is free for all OSU students and provides transportation to, from or around campus for anyone who doesn't feel comfortable walking at night. Call +1.541.737.5000 to schedule a ride.

PACKING

WEATHER

Summer and fall in Oregon are generally sunny and warm. It can get hot during the day (24-32°C), but cools down in the evening (10-15°C). Winter and spring bring lots of rain and occasionally snow. Temperatures range between 10°C and -1°C. It is very important to have a good raincoat and an umbrella. You can purchase these items after you arrive.

DRESS CODE

Most students at Oregon State University dress very casually. There is no official dress code.

FOOD

There are opportunities to cook for friends in the residence halls and for special events on campus. Many spices and food items from other countries can be found in Corvallis, but be sure to bring recipes with you.

CULTURAL ITEMS

There are many wonderful opportunities for international students to share their culture on campus during festivals and special events such as fashion shows international dinners, cultural exhibits, and talent shows. Please consider bringing your national dress, or other clothes associated with a hobby or sport you enjoy in your home country. For example: martial arts attire, costume for national dances, soccer or other sports team uniform, clothing worn for formal or religious ceremonies, etc. You may also wish to bring items of cultural interest, such as photos, books, souvenirs, recorded music, and musical instruments. INTO OSU produces an International Fair each year as part of International Education Week in November. so please bring something to share!

- Do not bring any sharp objects, liquids or gels as these will be taken by airport security.

ARRIVING IN THE US

LET US KNOW YOU ARE COMING

We would like to make your arrival in Oregon and transition to the OSU campus in Corvallis as smooth as possible. Please provide us with your flight arrival details so that we can make arrangements for you. You can also use this website to make a reservation for the INTO OSU Airport Shuttle Service.

For students living on campus, we request a passport photo so that we can have your OSU student ID card ready for you when you check into housing. The ID card can be used to purchase food and enter your hall.

When booking your flights you should arrive in Corvallis at least one day before your program start date stated on your I-20 or in your brochure. Please arrive at the INTO OSU Center by 8:00 am on your program start date.

ENTERING THE US


As an F-1 student, you are allowed to enter the US no earlier than 30 days before the program start date listed on item #5 of your I-20. Be sure to have the following documents with you on the plane and ready to present at the US Port of Entry:

- Original I-20
- Valid passport
- F-1 visa
- SEVIS I-901 fee payment receipt
- Documentation of finances for your first year of studies

CUSTOMS & IMMIGRATION

Form I-94

You may receive Form I-94 (below) or similar official document to complete during your flight. In order to enter the US as a student, you must complete the form provided to you and present it to the immigration official when you enter the US. The immigration official will stamp your form and/or your passport with your type of visa status. Do not lose this form! We will make copies of the Form I-94 and/or passport stamps at the Immigration Document Check-in and you may need it to leave the country.



US Customs Declaration Form

You will also receive the US Customs Declaration Form (below) to complete during your flight. You must complete this form and present it to the immigration official when you enter the US. The immigration official will stamp it and return it to you. You will then present it to the Customs official at a separate checkpoint. Do not lose this form! If you are traveling with dependents, you will need to complete only one of these forms.







ARRIVING IN OREGON



PORTLAND INTERNATIONAL AIRPORT (PDX)

The Portland International Airport (PDX) in Portland, Oregon, is the nearest international port of entry to Oregon State University.

INTO OSU AIRPORT SHUTTLE SERVICE

The INTO OSU Airport Shuttle Service is only offered from PDX. This is the safest, most convenient way to reach the university from the airport. The drive takes about two hours, and the service is available 24 hours a day. This service is included for all students. however, you must make a reservation at least 72 hours in advance to use it. Fees may apply for non-students.

FLIGHT DELAYS AND PROBLEMS

If your flight is delayed, you cannot find the INTO OSU Airport Shuttle, your baggage is lost or you experience any other problems during your travel to Oregon, please do not panic.

INTO OSU GREETING SERVICE

If you reserve the INTO OSU Airport Shuttle and arrive during the time frame listed below, you will receive the INTO OSU Greeting Service automatically and free of charge. You will be greeted by one of our staff members wearing a bright orange OSU shirt at baggage claim #9. They will escort you to your shuttle. For the best arrival experience, please plan to arrive during the times listed below. Outside these times, availability may be limited and additional charges may apply.

- Academic English and Pathway greeting service is offered on the Saturday and Sunday before your course start date, between 8:00 am and 8:00 pm.
- General English greeting service is offered on the Sunday before your course start date, between 8:00 am and 8:00 pm.

RESIDENCE HALL MOVE-IN DATES

On-campus housing accommodations in the residence halls will not be available until the weekend before your program start date. The specific move-in date for your program will be sent to you with confirmation of your housing reservation. If you arrive before your on-campus housing is ready, you will need to stay in a local hotel. Please see Hotels on page 19.



























YOUR HOUSING

LIVING ON CAMPUS

Undergraduate Pathway students are required to live in on-campus housing for their first three consecutive terms of study. Living in on-campus housing is optional for all other students. Priority is given to students who are required to live on campus. The most common room layout is for two students to share a bedroom, and four or more students share a bathroom. This arrangement is very popular in the United States.

Your move-in date will be sent to you by email when you receive confirmation of your housing reservation. The move-in date is usually 1-2 days before your program start date. If you arrive before your assigned move-in date, you will need to make temporary arrangements to stay in a hotel until you can move into the residence hall. Early check-in to your room may be available for an additional daily fee.

BED LINENS

If you will be living in a residence hall, a bed linen pack is included. These items are given to you and do not need to be returned when you leave. The pack includes:

- Bed sheets
- Pillowcase and pillow
- Blanket
- Towel and washcloth

If you find that you need additional bed or bath linens, there are several stores near campus where you can buy these and other necessities after you arrive.



Residence Halls include

- Shared bedrooms and limited single bedrooms
- Shared bathroom and limited single bathrooms
- Free high-speed internet connection (some halls require Ethernet cable connection)
- Free cable television connection (television not provided)
- · Free on-site laundry facility
- · Convenient location on campus
- Resident Assistant (RA) and Resident Director (RD) network of 24-hour support
- Dining facilities with a variety of food options

DINING ON CAMPUS

Meal plans are automatically included for all INTO OSU students with on-campus housing. The cash value of your meal plan will be loaded onto your OSU ID card. You will then use your OSU ID card as a debit card to pay for meals. OSU has three main dining centers, as well as many convenience stores, coffee shops and other cafes around campus. Remember to always bring your OSU ID card with you and use it to pay each time you eat. Additionally, residence halls have shared kitchens, which allow you to cook what you want - just for yourself or with a group of friends.

OFF-CAMPUS HOUSING

The INTO OSU Housing Office is not able to assist students eligible to live off campus with finding housing. If you want to rent an apartment or house, you should arrive 1-2 weeks before your program start date. Off-campus housing in Corvallis is very limited due to a recent increase in the number of students attending OSU. Please plan ahead and allow enough time to find a place to live in Corvallis. Be careful about paying for housing before you see it.

HOTELS IN CORVALLIS

Corvallis has several hotels within 8 kilometers (5 miles) of the OSU campus. You can contact the hotel by phone or internet and make a reservation using a credit card. When you make a reservation, ask about possible weekly discounts and tell them you are an OSU student. Many hotels require you to be at least 18 years old to rent a room.

If you plan to live off campus, bring enough money to cover the cost of setting up your new home. This could include first and last months' rent, security deposit, utility deposits for gas, electric and telephone and the first month's utility bills. There may also be expenses for household items (furniture, kitchen appliances, etc.). These deposits and rent can cost at least \$1,500 or more



























ORIENTATION

YOUR FIRST DAY & ORIENTATION

You should arrive in Corvallis at least one day before your program start date (refer to brochure or I-20 for start date). Orientation will begin at 8:00 am on your program start date. Do not be late. Please meet at Reception in the International Living-Learning Center at OSU.

Do not be late for Orientation on your program start date. Sessions start at 8:00 am! All orientation events are required. All students must attend.

At Orientation you will be able to:

- Complete an English level placement
- Open your OSU email account
- Learn about your resources at INTO OSU and OSU
- Confirm you have provided all required health and admissions documents
- Pay any balances you owe
- Learn about your student visa regulations
- Register for your classes
- Take a tour of OSU and Corvallis
- Receive your student handbook

Be sure to bring the following with you to Orientation:

- Passport, visa, I-94 card, and I-20
- Original transcripts or test scores, if needed (see Checklist - page 30)
- Immunization Documentation Form (page 8-9) and Health Information Form, if you did not submit it online

PLACEMENT & REGISTRATION

New students will take an English evaluation to determine their appropriate course level. Students cannot register for classes without doing the English evaluation, so do not be late. You will be able to register for your classes only after all admissions documents have been verified, full payment of tuition has been made and you have fulfilled the immunization requirement.

LATE REGISTRATION FEE

Students who arrive late, or do not complete the registration requirements on time, may be subject to a Late Registration Fee of \$250. This fee will be charged to your student account and you will not be able to register for your classes until all balances have been paid.

TEXTBOOKS

After you have registered for your courses, you will use your course list to select your textbooks from the OSU Bookstore. Textbooks can be expensive but used textbooks are often available in the Bookstore at lower prices. Approximate textbook pricing at INTO OSU:

- General English: \$150 -\$170 per two sessions (one academic term)
- Academic English: \$150 \$200 per academic term
- Pathway: \$200 \$450 per academic term, depending on your major

YOUR FIRST WEEK

DRIVING

To drive a car in the US, you will need to get an Oregon State Driver's License. You must pass a written knowledge test of US driving laws in English and a driving test. You will also have to wait until after you are enrolled in your classes and can provide proof of enrollment to the Department of Motor Vehicles before you will be able to get a driver's license. More information about how to obtain a license will be provided after you arrive.

COMPUTERS & INTERNET ACCESS

If you would like to use the internet from your room in the residence hall, you will need your own computer and an Ethernet cable. There is ample access to computer labs on campus, including a 24-hour lab and the INTO OSU Learning Center computer lab. All internet access is free. For students who would like to use WiFi from their laptops on campus, wireless internet access is available throughout the OSU campus.

APPLIANCES

US electrical outlets are 110 volts AC. If bringing appliances, phones, and other electronic items like computers or laptops, you may need a voltage adapter. In addition, the US has its own standard of electrical socket (NEMA), which may require a plug adapter as well.

We recommend purchasing most appliances and electronics after you arrive. Many appliances (like rice cookers or electric teapots) are not allowed in residence hall bedrooms and are provided free of charge in the residence hall kitchens.

KEEPING IN CONTACT WITH HOME

When you arrive in the US you will have traveled a long way from home and although this will be an exciting time, please do remember that your family and friends may worry about you. Remember to contact them and let them know that you are safe!

SKYPE

Skype is a free computer program that allows you to use your computer like a phone and place international calls to other Skype users for free. Depending on your computer, web cameras are also supported. Please go to www.skype.com for more information and to download for free.

TIPS FOR SUCCESS AT **INTO OSU**

- Attend ALL your classes. Attendance is required by your student visa.
- Always be on time to class. This is a show of respect.
- Do not use your cell phone during class.
- Be prepared for your classes. Bring your completed homework, textbooks, pens and paper.
- Care for others' feelings and cultures. Be kind in your words and actions.
- Feel free to ask questions whenever to the Welcome Desk!
- Join social events and sports clubs. Students who are involved with university life are more successful.
- Keep your room clean and tidy. It is your responsibility to clean up after yourself.

MONEY AND BANKING

BANK ACCOUNTS

When you arrive in Corvallis, you will need to open checking and/or savings account(s) with a bank. More information will be provided during Orientation. You usually need two pieces of picture identification (passport and OSU ID card), your local mailing address and money to open an account.

CASH & CREDIT/DEBIT CARDS

The currency in the United States is the US Dollar (US \$). It is divided into one hundred cents (100 cents). Bills are issued in \$100, \$50, \$20, \$10, \$5 and \$1. Coins are called a quarter (25 cents), a dime (10 cents), a nickel (5 cents) and a penny (1 cent). You should not carry large amounts of cash with you. However, plan to carry some smaller bills and change with you when you first arrive in the US for food, phone calls and other inexpensive purchases.

In the US, the most widely accepted credit cards are Visa and MasterCard. It is not easy for international students to obtain credit cards in the US. It is best to apply for a credit card in your home country. If you would like to take cash from your credit or debit account, you can use a Plus, Cirrus, Interlink or Star Network bank card to make a cash withdrawal. Cash machines are located in the airport, on the OSU campus, and around Corvallis.

TRANSFERRING MONEY

Some countries have strict rules about transferring money to the United States.

- Be sure that you have made the necessary arrangements with your government and familiarized yourself with your bank's procedures for transferring funds.
- It is a good idea to transfer enough money to cover expenses for one term, in addition to tuition paid. The amount of money you will need each term varies with your living situation and lifestyle. Students living off campus will have more monthly bills than students living on campus, and therefore need access to more cash.
- You should have access to at least \$500 or more, to cover books, cell phone deposit and plan, and other living expenses.

CELL PHONES

Most rooms in the residences halls have an active phone line that includes free local calling. If you would like to use the phone line in your room, you will need to purchase a phone. Phones are very inexpensive, starting from \$5. If you would like to have a cell phone while living in the US, Corvallis is covered by all four major providers (AT&T, Verizon, T-Mobile, and Sprint). For a monthly service plan, cell phone companies require a new customer to sign a two-year service agreement. Penalty charges apply if you cancel your contract within 2 years. If you do not want to sign a 2-year contract, you have a choice of pre-paid or pay-as-you-go plans. You will receive more information about buying a cell phone at Orientation.










CAMPUS MAP & KEY LOCATIONS






