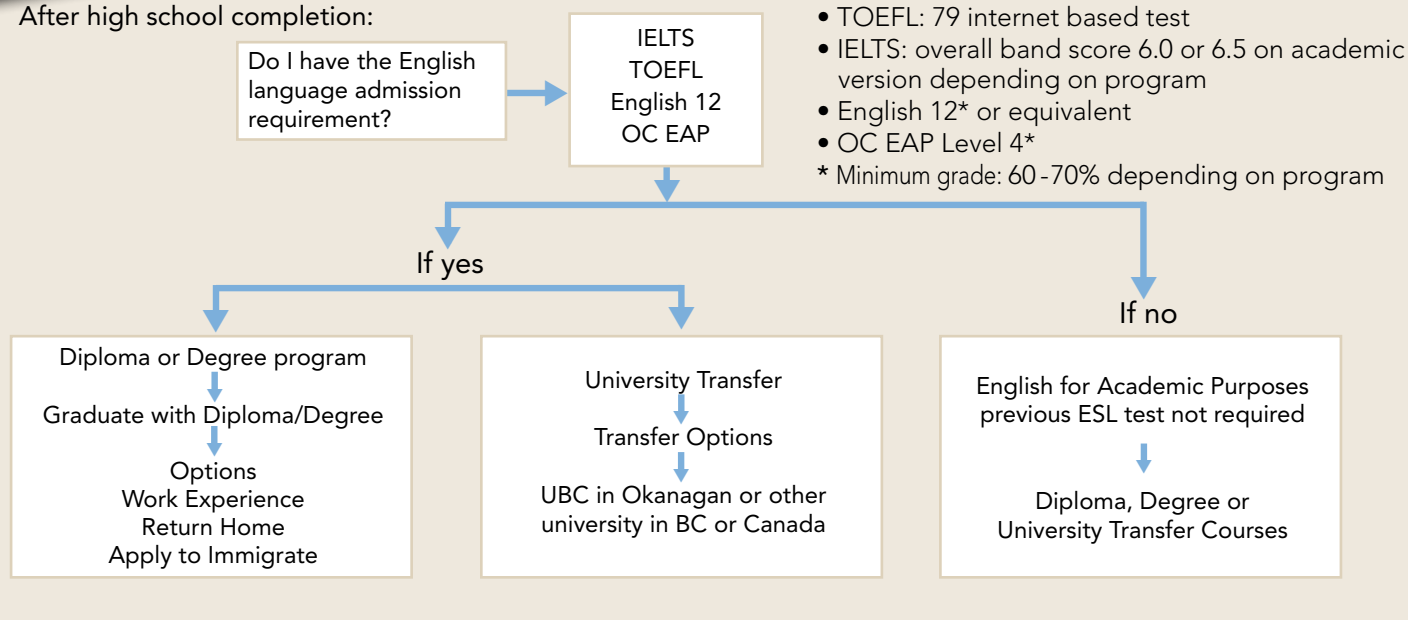

Degree Programs (four years)

Business Administration (BBA): specializations in Accounting, Finance, General Studies, Tourism and Hospitality Management, Human Resources Management, Management and Marketing

Computer Information Systems: specializations in Software Development, Computer Systems, and Database Systems

Associate Degree and University Transfer Programs (two years)

Associate of Arts Degree: with concentrations in Communications, Cross-Cultural Studies, Economics, English, Environmental Studies, History, Modern Languages, Philosophy, Political Science, Psychology, Sociology, Women's Studies

Associate of Science Degree: courses can include Astronomy, Biology, Chemistry, Computer Science, Earth and Environmental Sciences, Geography, Math and Statistics, Physics

English for Academic Purposes (EAP)

- Four intermediate to advanced levels (reading, writing, speaking and listening)
- Average of 20 hours/week of classroom instruction
- Programs begin in January, May, July and September
- A minimum grade of 60% at level 4 meets the English admission requirement to all degree and diploma programs at Okanagan College, except the BBA program.
- A minimum grade of 70% is required for the BBA program.
- A grade of 70% or more at level 4 meets the English admission requirement (ELAS) for UBC Okanagan, located in the city of Kelowna.
- Students at advanced EAP levels may combine EAP with many degree or diploma courses such as Business, Math, Computer Science, Economics, Psychology and Anthropology. (Some degree and diploma courses may also require additional pre-requisites. For example, many math courses require a pre-requisite of Math 12.)

English as a Second Language (ESL)

Two beginner levels, 20 hours per week (reading, writing, listening and speaking)



Transfer from Okanagan College to other Canadian universities, including: the University of British Columbia, Simon Fraser University, University of Victoria, Thompson Rivers University.

- UBC has a campus located in the city of Kelowna. Successful completion of Okanagan College's English for Academic Purposes (EAP) Program meets UBC's English language admission requirement (ELAS).

- For programs of study longer than six months, applicants must obtain study permits from the nearest Canadian Visa Office.
